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WORSHIP CAMP INFORMATION

Description

The LU School of Music Worship Camp is available to students from Grades 9 through 12 who love to worship through singing or playing an instrument (Students completing their 8th grade year – *Rising 9th graders* – are also welcome to attend). Instruction in Biblical foundations for worship, worship leading techniques, improvisation, and music theory will be provided. As part of the music theory class students will learn how to read and write charts for worship. Each student will participate on an assigned praise team and receive daily group coaching as a full team and in vocal and instrumental sectionals. All worship students will participate in the mixed choral ensemble to learn concepts of choral worship leading techniques. Worship campers will enjoy a busy, fun-filled week of rehearsing, learning more about music and worship, and making new friends.

Worship Camp Auditions on Sunday Evening

Each worship camper must prepare a solo selection prior to arriving at camp. Students will perform this selection before two of the worship camp faculty in an informal audition on Sunday evening following the worship service and orientation. This audition will be used to place students into worship teams. Memorization is welcome, but not required.

Performance Opportunities

The Worship Camp holds two performances on the final day of camp, which are open to the public. Parents and relatives are encouraged to attend.

Saturday Performances

At 1:00 p.m. – Worship campers will perform in one of the afternoon Worship Programs. Student worship groups will lead worship during these worship program.

At 6:00 p.m. – Select worship groups will lead worship during this Evening Worship Service and Concert for the camp. All worship campers will participate in the worship service singing as part of the Camp Mixed Worship Chorus.

PIANO CAMP INFORMATION

Description

The LU School of Music Piano Camp is available to students from Grades 9 through 12 who have studied piano for at least two years, and are currently studying privately (Students completing their 8th grade year – *Rising 9th graders* – are also welcome to attend). Instruction in piano technique, keyboard literature, improvisation, ensemble playing, and music theory will be provided. Each student will receive two piano lessons during the camp that will emphasize a variety of music styles. All Piano Camp students will also participate in a mixed chorus. Piano campers will enjoy a busy, fun-filled week of performing, learning more about music, and making new friends.

Piano Camp Auditions on Sunday Evening

Each piano camper must prepare at least two brief solo selections prior to arriving at camp. Students will perform these selections before two of the piano camp faculty in an informal audition on Sunday evening. Memorization is welcome, but not required.

Performance Opportunities

The Piano Camp holds two performances on the final day of camp, which are open to the public. Parents and relatives are encouraged to attend.

Saturday Performances

At 3:00 p.m. – Piano campers will perform in one of the afternoon Piano Recitals. Students may perform solo works or ensemble works as directed by piano camp faculty.

At 6:00 p.m. – Select piano students will perform solos on the Evening Worship Service and Concert, which will also include all piano campers singing with the Camp Mixed Worship Chorus.

BAND CAMP INFORMATION

Description

The LU School of Music Summer Band Camp is designed for students in the 9th through 12th grades (Students completing their 8th grade year – *Rising 9th graders* – are also welcome to attend). This band camp offers a comprehensive music experience focused on developing the player in addition to developing playing techniques. At this one-week intensive camp, campers will participate in daily band rehearsals and attend classes that include music theory, sectionals, master classes, chamber ensembles, and improvisation. Students will also have opportunity to explore other styles of music including jazz and contemporary praise and worship.

Band Camp Auditions on Sunday Evening

After the opening worship service and orientation on Sunday evening, each band camper will complete an informal placement audition before two of the band camp faculty. In preparation for this audition, students must prepare a brief solo selection prior to arriving at camp. Memorization is welcome, but not required.

Performance Opportunities

Performance opportunities are also an integral part of the camp experience. The Band Camp holds three performances on the final day of camp, which are open to the public. Parents and relatives are encouraged to attend. Students and student chamber ensembles may be selected to perform in the Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital. Details about the Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital will be available during camp registration. All students will perform in the final Band Concert. Also, all students will attend the final Worship Service on Saturday evening. Some band camp students may be selected to participate in this concert.

Saturday Performances

At 11:00 a.m. – The band performance for of all students participating in the Band camp.

At 2:00 p.m. – The Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital. Students and student chamber groups may be selected to perform in this recital.

At 6:00 p.m. – Select band camp students will perform on the Evening Worship Service and Concert.

ORCHESTRA CAMP INFORMATION

Description

The LU School of Music Summer Orchestra Camp is designed for students in the 9th through 12th grades (Students completing their 8th grade year – *Rising 9th graders* – are also welcome to attend). The LU School of Music Summer Orchestra Camp provides students opportunity to perform in a Symphony Orchestra while gaining valuable experience in chamber ensembles. As part of this one-week intensive camp, students are immersed in orchestral and chamber music literature while developing their technical skills and musicianship. Students will attend daily orchestra rehearsals, sectionals, and master classes. In addition, each student will take classes in music theory and improvisation while exploring other styles of music including jazz and contemporary praise and worship.

Orchestra Camp Auditions on Sunday Evening

After the opening worship service and orientation on Sunday evening, each orchestra camper will complete a brief placement audition before two of the orchestra camp faculty. This audition is used to determine placement in the Orchestra and assignment to a chamber ensemble. In preparation for this audition, students must prepare two brief solo selections prior to arriving at camp. Memorization is welcome, but not required.

Performance Opportunities

Performance opportunities are also an integral part of the camp experience. The Orchestra Camp holds three performances on the final day of camp, which are open to the public. Parents and relatives are encouraged to attend. Students and student chamber ensembles may be selected to perform in the Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital. Details about the Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital will be available during camp registration. All students will perform in the final Orchestra Concert. Also, the orchestra will perform during the final Worship Service and Concert on Saturday evening.

Saturday Performances

At 2:00 p.m. – The Honors Solo and Chamber Ensemble Recital. Students and student chamber groups may be selected to perform in this recital.

At 4:00 p.m. – The Orchestra performance for all students participating in the orchestra camp.

At 6:00 p.m. – The orchestra will perform on the Evening Worship Service and Concert.

JAZZ CAMP INFORMATION

Description

The LU School of Music Summer Jazz Camp is designed for students in the 9th through 12th grades (Students completing their 8th grade year – *Rising 9th graders* – are also welcome to attend). Our Jazz Camp takes jazz instruction to the next level by providing students the opportunity to play and perform in a big band jazz ensemble as well as with a small combo. Campers will take daily classes in music theory, jazz techniques, and improvisation. Students will also participate in evening jam sessions, performing for faculty while practicing improvisation skills with other campers. All ability levels are welcome, though campers should have at least one year of school band instruction or equivalent.

Jazz Camp Auditions on Sunday Evening

After the opening worship service and orientation on Sunday evening, each jazz camper will complete an informal placement audition before two of the jazz camp faculty. In preparation for this audition, students must prepare a brief solo selection prior to arriving at camp. As part of this audition, students may be asked to improvise over blues changes.

Performance Opportunities

Performance opportunities are also an integral part of the camp experience. The Jazz Camp holds nightly informal performances during jam sessions. Students are encouraged to attend these sessions each night. Students also perform in three concerts on the final day of camp, which are open to the public. Parents and relatives are encouraged to attend. Student jazz combos will perform in an afternoon jazz combo concert. The Jazz Ensemble will perform a final concert on Saturday afternoon. All students will attend the final Worship Service on Saturday evening. Some jazz camp students may be selected to participate in this concert.

Saturday Performances

At 12:00 p.m. – The Jazz Ensemble Concert for all students participating in the Jazz Camp.

At 2:00 p.m. – The Jazz Combo Concert. Student jazz combos will perform in this recital.

At 6:00 p.m. – Select Jazz camp students will perform on the Evening Worship Service and Concert.

Ability Level	All ability levels; campers should have at least one year of school instruction or equivalent. (Piano camp students are required to have at least two years of private instruction.)

Packing for Camp

When packing for camp, please keep in mind that:

- Bring only what you really need. Each room will house three students, so do not overpack.
- Be sure to mark ALL your belongings with your name.
- If something has sentimental value to you - leave it at home!

MUSIC ITEMS

- Your Instrument - the only exceptions to this are:
 - *Piano at either the Piano Camp or the Jazz Camp*
- A folding music stand labeled with your name
- Music you want to work on at camp

BASIC ROOM ITEMS

- Sheets for extra long twin bed
If you cannot find extra long sheets, you can use two standard twin flat sheets.
- Blanket (*the rooms can be chilly*)
- Pillow & Pillow Case
- Bath Towel
- Personal toiletries including shampoo & soap
- Hand Towel/Washcloth
- Small lamp or personal reading light
If you want to be able to read, write, etc... especially after the room light has been turned out you'll need to bring your own.
- Alarm Clock
- Refillable water bottle
- Sunscreen

ELECTRONICS

If you decide to bring personal electronic devices such as laptop computers, playstations, ipods, cameras, etc), please understand the following:

- There is no place to secure them when not in use and when you are not in your room.
- The rooms do not have safes and there is no lockable location for them to be kept.
- These items are your responsibility. The camps are not responsible for damage, theft, or loss of any personal item.
- You are sharing a small room with two other people and constantly moving between buildings and rooms. It's easy to leave something behind, for something to go missing, or for you to go to your next class without it.

FOOD ITEMS

You are permitted to bring snack items with you for your room, but we ask you to follow these guidelines:

- Your roommates may have allergies to which you are unaware. Please bring only food items that are individually sealed & packaged, and consider bringing nut-free items.
- There are no refrigerators. Anything you bring will need to be kept at room temp.
- Consider refillable water bottles rather than a case of water

CLOTHING ITEMS

- Casual clothes
- Sports clothes
- Sunday clothes (attendance at Thomas Road Baptist Church)
- Swim suit
- Tennis shoes
- Rain jacket or umbrella
- Sweater or sweatshirt (rehearsal rooms may get chilly)
- Hat or sunvisor
- Sunglasses

**SAFETY NOTE - though flip flops may be comfortable summer footwear, they can often be dangerous. When the campus sidewalks get wet after a rainstorm they are extremely slick. There are also a lot of stairs in the buildings on campus. Flip Flops easily get caught on the edge and suddenly you're face planting into the stairs. We encourage you to consider bringing only footwear that won't land you in the hospital.*

PERFORMANCE CLOTHES

- For Girls: Black Skirt or Pants (skirt must be below the knee); White Blouse; Black Shoes; Stockings
- For Boys: Black Trousers, White Dress Shirts (long or short sleeve); Long, Dark Tie; Black Shoes; Black Socks.

MEDICATIONS

For the safety of all campers, no medications (prescription nor over-the-counter) may be kept in the dorm rooms. All medications (excluding vitamins) must be given to the counselors on check-in day.

When packing up medication to bring to camp, please:

1. Pack up any medications in a large ziplock bag clearly marked with the students name,
2. Include a sheet of the most current dosing information inside the bag as well.
3. Provide ample medication for the entire duration of camp
4. Ensure that the medications have actually been given to the counselor on the first day of camp.

Don't forget to pick up your left-over medications on check-out day!
